

# THE BATTLE OF SOUTH MOUNTAIN 150 YEARS LATER

After a year and a half of preparations, the South Mountain Sesquicentennial Committee welcomed many visitors to Burkittsville and Middletown during the week of September 10 - 14. Burkittsville's big day came on Friday, September 14, 2012, opened by a Commemorative Service at South Mountain Heritage Society. This was followed with guided walking tours of Burkittsville, which were enjoyed by visitors from as far away as Montana.



The service opened with the pealing of the 1896 church bell, and the procession and presentation of Civil War colors. During the service, Adele Air (Educational Director of the National Museum of Civil War Medicine), Catherine Cox (President of South Mountain Heritage Society), Reverend James Moss, and Jody Brumage (Historian and Curator of South Mountain Heritage Society) spoke, sharing primary sources left by the soldiers and civilians of the Civil War era in Burkittsville and the nearby area.
