

Women in Burkittsville!

Celebrating Women's History Month!

March was Women's History Month and we in Burkittsville have some women worth celebrating! Our little village was once the site of The Burkittsville Female Seminary. The school officially opened on October 15, 1866 by Rev. William C. Wire of St. Paul's Lutheran Church. Here female students were instructed in academics such as arithmetic, history, latin, chemistry, and intellectual philosophy.

Burkittsville's appreciation for well-educated women does not stop there! Our residents have been subject to the leadership of several female mayors including Deborah Aughenbaugh who was the first women to serve as Burkittsville Mayor 1986-1994. Longtime resident Joyce Brown led us through the controversial

Blair Witch saga in the late 1990s as Mayor of Burkittsville. Mayor Deborah Burgoyne is currently serving in office.

We have been home to celebrated female artists such as Margaret Kennedy, Female Executives in business, Lawyers, and many town council seats have been held by capable women throughout our history!

Thank you to all of the women that have helped to shape Burkittsville into the wonderful community it is today!

Spring

Spring is here and butterfly season will soon be upon us! One way to help butterflies and other pollinators to succeed is to plant native plants that they prefer.

Last year, Burkittsville had a shortage of milkweed! Our monarchs ate through what was grown in town. We were able to have some of the butterflies transferred to other areas that could accommodate them. Our Green Team has provided us with

a few resources to learn more about what we can do to help.

The Xerces Society for Invertebrate Conservation (https://xerces.org/) is a good place to start to learn about ways you can help. For example, they share information about where to buy milkweed seeds for varieties native to Maryland.

Think about what you can do to this season!

- Butterfly Milkweed (Asclepias tuberosa)
- □ Swamp Milkweed (Asclepias incarnata)
