Updates, Postmaster comments

Rebuilding is underway on the Burkittsville Post Office after the December 2019 fire. Owners and Contractors are working hard to restore our historic post office in keeping with town aesthetics. All the chestnut logs used in the original construction will be saved! All logs that are structurally sound will be retained in the building's reconstruction. Any logs that are unable to be saved in this manor will be repurposed and utilized inside the post office. We do not yet have a date for the

reopening but we are pleased with the amount of work getting done. Meanwhile our own Postmaster, Kennedy Boone, is still serving the community in a mobile postal office truck parked behind St. Paul's Church in town. Kennedy stated that he is happy with his



temporary workspace. Mr. Boone went on to say that he "would be nervous working in a brick and mortar building right now" with the Covid-19 virus going around. He says he is well distanced and isolated to protect from the virus. He did say none of the local postal workers were showing any symptoms of the virus and that the postal service is providing workers with anything they need to protect themselves and others from the virus.

Kennedy is happy to continue working in our community and making his customers laugh.


Updates and Announcements
