Since at least as early as the 1870s, Burkittsville residents have gathered on New Year's Eve to ring the church bells in town. This tradition of marking the New Year has continued for almost 150 years with this year being no different. Residents and guests gathered at 11:30pm on December 31st 2018 at the South Mountain Heritage Society for a small reception with light refreshments. The museum was still decorated for the holiday season and made a pretty backdrop to celebrate the end of 2018 and to welcome 2019. Just before midnight the gathering moved to the bell towers in both the Heritage Society and St. Paul's Lutheran Church. As we counted down to midnight, Mayor Debby Burgoyne, Resident Don Hongell, and Jody Brumage, Vice President SMHS took their places to start

the ringing. At the stroke of midnight the celebratory knell could be heard throughout the surrounding valley. After everyone present took turns ringing the bells, Mr. Brumage tolled a single bell in the tower of SMHS 19 times signifying the beginning of 2019, literally ringing in the New Year. Remembering Diane Morton

The South Mountain Heritage Society is saddened by the loss of our friend and associate, Diane Morton, on December 19, 2018. She was devoted to the old Resurrection Reformed Church. During her board presidency, Diane obtained a grant from the Maryland Historical Trust and oversaw the major restoration that brought the building back to its 1896 Victorian appearance.

For many visitors to the heritage society, Diane was the first person they met and the one they remembered most. Over many years, Diane volunteered her Saturdays every October to be at the used-book sale, greeting customers, engaging in


conversations, and sharing her love for and diverse collection of music. Each Christmas, during the annual "Museums by Candlelight" program, Diane designed unique Christmas ornament crafts for our younger visitors to construct and take home with them afterwards.




