Stink Bugs - Getting creative and Getting Even In Our Homes

I know there has been contention over identifying these bugs vs. local brown stink bugs. I'm reporting what conclusions have been reached by experts. I know those could be wrong, too, but it's what we have to work with. For now, these bugs are not being considered native, and their numbers are not considered part of a normal growth cycle.

What We Can Do In Our Homes

I hope that this section encourages people to look at new, effective home solutions for stink-bug control, and most importantly, to share ideas with neighbors!


The best defense against **eggs** indoors is the vacuum. Taking down curtains, looking everywhere twice and continuing your mission is said to be most effective.

The Bugs are something else again. They can be killed with common dish soap, ammonia (yellow windex), nicotine jars and sticky traps, but how to get them without the smell has resulted in some interesting inventions!

They are attracted to fruity, sweet smells, bright colors, especially yellow (though blue and hot pink work) and they will go toward light. Most of these are used in traps. I've even seen an indoor buglight with some modifications that works quite well.

Repelling the bugs: Garlic smell repels stink bugs. Go figure! Please write in if you hear of more repellant inventions.

I'll include one invention here, and then give you a couple **links to more resources**. Also, there is one commercial product out there that I keep hearing about- 'bugzooka.'



You'll need a can which is wide enough to hold a decent quantity of bugs (I caught 80 in the first two days of using this), and it should be tall enough so that a family pet can't try to drink from it. Into this, put an inch of water and scented dish soap. Pour a little cooking oil on top, this surface smothers the bug's discharge if they get set off, and the soapy water smothers them as they sink. It'll still smell, but nowhere near as bad as one going off in the open air.
