Still Running Strong

Spook Hill Cider & Wine 4 Mile Run 10th Anniversary This October!

The first Spook Hill Cider & Wine 4 Mile Run was run in 2008, this year's will be Saturday, October 20th, a decade later. The Town of Burkittsville, MD, congratulates the SMHS's Spook Hill Team on this



The latest on this year's event, including course change, traffic and how to join in the fun.

As in years past, the run will be headquartered out of the Burkittsville Ruritan Community Center. The run will start on the road in front of the Ruritan at 8:30 a.m. and take approximately 500 participants on a nice tour of Town, Boordy's South Mountain Vineyard, Burkittsville Union Cemetery, and the Distillery Lane Ciderworks' orchard before finishing at the Kuritan.

We seem to have more town residents running (and volunteering!) each year at Spook Hill. If you've been seen running through town, why not join us for a unique opportunity to tour your hometown with 500 new friends? Register or volunteer via links that can be found at www.spookhill4mile.org. (You can see the Wine Trail map here, too!)

What's changed on the course this year?

We won't be sending runners down Lakeside Dr. after the start this year, but will be sending them straight up Main St., all the way to and then on Mountain Church Rd. for a short distance. On their way back through town on their way to the Ciderworks, runners will exit the Cemetery behind St. Paul and follow Cemetery Ln. downhill then turn left onto East Main Street.

The morning of Spook Hill is a great opportunity to come out and cheer runners on AND to taste some of the fantastic wines that are made from grapes grown on the shoulder of South Mountain by Boordy, and it's always a good day to visit Distillery Lane Ciderworks! Tasting fees apply at each venue, but this is a unique opportunity to sample Boordy's wares without leaving town! Boordy Vineyards will be offering tastings (expect to pay a modest fee) at the playground/ basketball court on the east end of Town from 9:30 to about 11:00. This is a great chance to locally taste wine made from grapes grown right here on the shoulder of South Mountain!

I want to say thank you for your continued support to the Mayor and Town Council, Burkittsville Ruritan Club, Distillery Lane Ciderworks and Boordy Vineyards, without any of whom this important fundraiser for SMHS would not be possible. I also wish to thank all of our residents in advance for their cooperation with regard to this year's run and the support that they have lent to the event since our first run in 2008!

On Spook Hill Race Day Parking, Road Closures &

Expected Traffic Delays: Race Morning Parking

East Main St. residents who cannot park elsewhere, are asked park on the south side (even numbered side) of the street. West Main St. residents, please park on the south side (even numbered side) of Main St. or at the SMHS/St. Paul's Church parking lot. We thank you for help and cooperation. You keep the event safer for participants and property.

Race Day Road Closures & Traffic Delays In preparation for the run, there will be road closures beginning at 8:15 a.m. on the morning of Saturday, October 20th.

- East Main St./Gapland Rd. will be closed between the Distillery Lane Ciderworks entrance and MD 17 from 8:15 until 9:30.
- West Main St./Gapland Rd. between MD 17 and the intersection of Mountain Church Road will be closed from 8:25 until approximately
- Mountain Church Rd. will be closed from the intersection with W. Main St./Gapland Rd. and the entrance to the Boordy vineyard from 8:30 until approximately 8:55.
- MD 17 at Main St. and at Cemetery Lane will be manned by fire/police personnel and they will allow traffic to pass as runner density permits. Expect delays at these intersections between 8:30 and 9:15.
- Lakeside Drive and all other alleys intersecting with East Main St. will be closed to traffic at E. Main St. from 8:15 until approximately 9:30.
- Seminary Ln. will be closed to traffic from 8:30 until approximately 9:15.
- Cemetery Lane will be closed to traffic from 8:30 until approximately 9:15.

What if I need to leave town during the event?

If you absolutely have to proceed through town from where you've parked during the event, wait until runner density has lessened and proceed with utmost caution, at very slow speed, and leave Main St. at the first opportunity.

Town Working With FEMA

Mayor and Council have been working with FEMA identifying the road damage done during the spring floods. This has been a long hot process.

All projects have been identified and approved. We are now awaiting the funding. The wheels of Government do grind slowly.

Playground Improvements

Playground additions are on the way. The long, careful process involved acquiring funding via a great grant, and our regular town meetings, featuring contractors who answered questions about safety, accessibility, how the additions would blend into the streetscape of our historic village, the Green aspects of the materials, and more.

After careful consideration of so much information and feedback, Burkittsville has reached the final stretch. Plans for the playground can be viewed on the bulletin board across from the Post Office or on www.burkittsville-md.gov on the Government page. This was quite an achievement. The children are not the only ones who'll be happy about these additions. Thanks to Council Members to Rachel Caballo, Rebecca Remaley and everyone else who helped this project along the way.

CREEKSIDE PARK

Some exciting news from the Mayor and Council- Burkittsville has acquired the property 104 East Main Street (it is an empty lot, which will be another public space, working name Creekside Park). Not only will it preserve our historic streetscape, this parcel was identified as a critical piece of our Town Master Plan, Greenstreet, and Storm Water Management Plans. It took a lot of work, but this key area is now part of town property, at the cost of 27 thousand dollars.

Where is the money coming from? We have applied for POS Acquisition Funds for the property. Each County is allotted a certain amount of these funds, which is then shared with the Municipalities. Burkittsville's share should more than cover the cost of Creekside Park.




