Santa's sleigh could be seen displayed at the Boyer Farm on Broad Run this Holiday season. Originally displayed on the front lawn of the Guyton Residence in town, this mechanical, hand-made decoration is a small piece of Burkittsville History. Built in 1945, it was loaned to the Guytons by a Mr. Robert E. Greenwood of Petersville, who told Mr. Guyton if he wanted it he knew where it was.

In 1957 Mr. Greenwood and his friend Ralph F. Ridgeway were attempting to fly a plane under the bridge at Point of Rocks. The two-seater, single engine Ercoupe crashed. Tragically, neither man survived. Mr. Greenwood, 35, a WWII Marine veteran, and a 10 year member of the Brunswick Elks, left Santa and the reindeer in Burkittsville.

The Guytons displayed the sleigh every holiday season from 1950-1965, where Rudolf and the rest of the display were animated by its ingenious machienery, adding holiday cheer to the town. It was then stored in at the end of 1965. It is now displayed by Mr. Wayne Guyton's daughter, Denise, in her front yard accompanied by a sign listing a few facts about the decoration. Also displayed in Burkittsville with Santa's sleigh was a manger scene that Wayne and his mother bought in Hagerstown in 1950. Wayne's son displayed the manger on his property on Picnic Woods Road.

SMHS Preservation Projects Supported by MHAA Grant

Last summer, SMHS was awarded an \$11,000.00 grant from the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority to support necessary maintenance and improvements to the historic Resurrection Reformed Church.

The first project completed was the re-flooring of the center section of the front porch. This section of the building dates to 1860 and is the main entrance for visitors to the museum. Water damage and rot had weakened several of the boards. With this repair completed, the porch is once again safe for visitors to walk on.

Poor drainage of water from the roof and exposure to weather had severely damaged some of the east windows of the church. Installed during the renovations of 1860, the church's large Gothic windows are essential to the building's historical integrity. Several panes that had worn loose from the muntins were replaced and the windows were re-glazed. A protective outer covering of Lexan, a polycarbonate plastic, was placed over the exterior of these windows to protect them from damage as well as improving the indoor climate efficiency by sealing off air leakage.

Due to the museum's location on a hillside, water drainage posed a serious threat to the back wing of the museum. This section of the building, added in 1894, is of balloon-frame construction and is covered in clapboard. A new drainage ditch keeps water from resting against the siding, causing wood rot.

We appreciate the support of the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority in providing the grant money to fund these essential improvements and the Heritage Society is very grateful to our Burkittsville neighbors Ed Quinn and Jad Drake for their fine work.

Sustainable Burkittsville Survey

Thirty-three Burkittsville residents from 23 households responded to the Sustainable Burkittsville survey. This represents a household response rate of roughly 37%.

As a result of the survey, the Green Team gained new members: Paul and Shelby Beaver, Kim Hughes, John Marston, and Chuck Rounds have joined Green Team Leader Lisa Orr, Co-Leader Deborah Burgoyne, Charlie Cottingham and Kirsten Mortimer. The team will be meeting in the near future to assess the survey findings and develop an action plan. Some preliminary key survey findings include:

*55% of respondents indicated they were very familiar with and interested in sustainability and it factored into their lifestyle choices. They are actively taking steps to increase their home's energy efficiency or adopt environmentally friendly practices.

*65% said their household should do as much as possible to create a safe and sustainable future for their families, the Burkittsville community, and the planet, while 23% went further and said they should serve as an active role model and leader for sustainability in our community.

*The Natural Resource topics of greatest concern to residents were water pollution and drinking water quality, followed closely by fertilizer/pesticide run-off, illegal discharges, septic system problems, and loss of songbirds, bats and wildlife habitat.

The Center, made possible in part by a \$37,000 Project Open Space grant, is called "Green" for the sustainable nature of the intended building materials and fixtures, This Center should provide an area with access to local information, a public, accessible rest room and a section for storage. Pastor Jeanne has served several local congregations and is also a Spiritual Director, training at Shalem Institute for Spirituality.


Pastor Jeanne told us "I have known Pastor Kim through the years and she has always had wonderful things to say about the folks here in Burkittsville".
